Our February 7th program will be given by Guest Speaker Curt Roseman. His topic will be "Historic Bridges of the Quad Cities." A native of Moline, IL, Professor Roseman received a B. A. degree from Augustana College and a Ph. D. from the

University of Iowa (1969), both in geography. He is Professor Emeritus of Geography at the University of Southern California, having been on the faculty at the University of Illinois (1969-1985) and USC (1985-2004). He has published scores of articles, chapters, and books on human and cultural geography, was awarded a Fulbright Fellowship for research in New Zealand in 1989, and was selected as the 2005 Distinguished Scholar by the Ethnic Geography Specialty Group of the Association of American Geographers. His most recent research focuses on the historical geography of the Upper Mississippi River region and of Los Angeles.

The Rock Island Arsenal Historical Society sponsored a monthly *History Break*, a lunch and learn event, throughout 2012. Each *History Break* focused on a topic related to Rock Island Arsenal history, as the arsenal celebrated its 150th anniversary on July 12, 2012. A total of 305 arsenal employees and members of the general public attended the 12 events. The events could not have been successful without the dedication of three members of the board of directors. Linda Miller took reservations from the general public throughout the year. Anne Jochum submitted publicity to the local media each month. Jim Jochum participated in setting up the monthly events.

One arsenal employee, Debbie Gellerstedt, attended all 12 History Breaks. To acknowledge her accomplishment, she received a certificate of achievement from Mr. Joel Himsl, Garrison Manager, and a one year free membership in the Rock Island Arsenal Historical Society.

Museum News November and December 2012

On Thursday, November 1, 2012, Kris Leinicke presented a program on the Rock Island Barracks to the Moline Literary and Fine Arts Guild. The program was held at the Butterworth Center, Moline, Illinois, with 15 in attendance.

On Thursday, November 8, 2012, Fran Riley with Channel 6 KWQC filmed inside the museum and interviewed museum volunteer Morris Merle and Directorate of Plans, Training, Mobilization, and Security (DPTMS)' Neonia Wick-Markin, for a *Fran Riley Features* segment in honor of Veterans Day. The segment aired on 9 November 2012.

On Thursday, November 8, 2012, the History Break lunch and learn program featured "Mississippi River Navigation History" presented by Sam Heilig, Park Ranger with the U.S. Corps of Engineers, Rock Island District. Twenty-three employees and members of the general public attended this program.

On Saturday, November 10, 2012, Jodean Rousey Murdock provided an orientation for student volunteer, Brendan Massengale. Brendan will be volunteering at the museum to fulfill his service learning hours at Pleasant Valley High School.

On Wednesday, November 14, 2012, William Johnson attended the Senior Leader Emergency Management Seminar covering the Installation Emergency Management Plan.

On Wednesday, November 14, 2012, Kris Leinicke presented a program on Women at Rock Island Arsenal in the First and Second World Wars to the Golden Scholar Program, co-sponsored by Black Hawk College and the QC Plus 60 Club. The program was held at the Arsenal Golf Clubhouse, with 82 in attendance.

On Friday, November 16, 2012, David Feeney and Lori Feeney Behling donated their father's Centennial Committee paperweight and photographs to the museum. The paperweight was placed in the Centennial/Sesquicentennial exhibit in the museum.

On Tuesday, December 4, 2012, Kris Leinicke presented a program on the Sesquicentennial of the Rock Island Arsenal to the Jackson County Historical Society. The program was held at the Clinton Engines building, Maquoketa, Iowa, with 33 members in attendance.

On Monday, December 10, 2012, The Rock Island Arsenal Historical Society's website went live. Jodean Rousey Murdock and Jim Jochum worked on the website project. On Thursday, December 13, 2012, the History Break lunch and learn program featured "The Rock Island Civil War Prison: Andersonville of the North?", a Heritage Documentaries video, presented by Ron Deiss, Rock Island District, U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. Twenty-nine employees and members of the general public attended this program.

On Tuesday, December 18, 2012, Jodean Rousey Murdock provided an orientation to potential volunteer Nick Weime.

On Wednesday, December 26, 2012, work began on the project to block in the windows on the north wall of the Museum Resource Center. The stone work continued into January 2013.

During the months of November and December, the North Avenue improvement project continued. A place for a bus to park along North Avenue in front of the museum was included in the project. Handicap parking spaces and reserved parking spaces for museum visitors are now located in the lot to the north of North Avenue. The two Spanish cannon in front of the museum have been temporarily removed until new concrete bases can be fabricated. Additional improvements will be made in the spring.
